## Two Congregations Celebrate 150 Years of Ministry

First Moravian Church of Uhrichsville, Ohio 150th Anniversary - October 24, 2024 Reflection by Rev. David Geyer

It was in the early 1870s that local Moravians caught a vision for planting a church in Uhrichsville – a growing transportation hub and the heart of the local clay industry. Efforts might have faltered with the onset of 'The Long Depression' following the panic of 1873, but with characteristic determination and grit, local residents overcame every obstacle to founded the congregation on October 24, 1874.

Over the last 150 years, successive generations have shared in worship, fellowship, outreach and faith formation, all supported by an outstanding music program. As with many churches, the congregation has witnessed a decline in numbers over recent decades. Yet rather than grow passive, this "small but mighty" congregation has redoubled its efforts to serve the community, particularly through food ministries. Beginning by offering an inexpensive 'Dinner on the Run' each month, in 2019 the congregation additionally launched 'Ladles of Love', a twice monthly free dinner for takeout and delivery to local shut-ins. Assisted volunteers from Fry's Vallev Gnadenhutten Moravian Churches and the neighborhood, Ladles of Love now serves 400 free meals to the community every month.

Berea Moravian Church in St. Charles, Minnesota 150th Anniversary - December 4, 2024 Reflection by Pastor Jodi Heim

The year 2024 brings a wonderful celebration of Berea's 150th anniversary. What joy was shared by many at the community celebration held in August and the following morning's celebratory worship service was alive with the Holy Spirit, recounting the unique history of Berea's congregation. December will bring a more intimate celebration with a candlelight service, Lovefeast and a fellowship meal to follow, honoring those that acted on their shared fortitude to follow their hearts and begin a Moravian church ministry on the other side of the valley from Bethany and Hebron.

I will share here the words of our closing worship. Rev. Richard Splies, at the end of the centennial sermon, uses the words of Rev Eugene Michel as he closes his sermon of the 50th celebration. And I close our 150th celebration with the same: "Today, we stand together at the threshold of great opportunities in the service of the Lord unto one another and to the world around us. It is our privilege in the coming days and years to work together in this congregation that fifty years from today, those who may be privileged to celebrate the two hundredth anniversary of this congregation will greatly rejoice to recount the accomplishments which the Lord desires to achieve." What a beautiful vision of Berea and its people as they continue their ministry of the religion of the heart.

## Hispanic Heritage Month: New Resources for Informed Ministry

Under the leadership of Board of World Mission staff member Rev. Angelica Regalado-Cieza, a cohort representing the Northern and Southern Provinces has been formed to learn more about immigration issues in the United States through a Fuller Theological Seminary course. We have compiled the public resources shared during this course and made them accessible for use in Moravian congregations and ministries ministering to individuals and communities impacted by immigration.



#### Moravian Disaster Response to Hurricane Helene

The Board of World Mission is the agency that coordinates the North American Moravian response to disasters around the world. While Hurricane Helene came ashore as a category four hurricane in Florida's panhandle, some of its most significant damage came in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Tennessee and North Carolina. Laurel Ridge, the Moravian Camp and Conference Center in North Carolina, is located about 40 miles east of Boone, right in the middle of one of these hard-hit areas. This region received more than 20 inches of rain with sustained winds of over 50 mph. This has caused widespread power outages, landslides, downed trees, and severe flooding. Laurel Ridge has sustained water damage in Higgins Lodge and several of the summer camp cabins. High winds have brought down a large number



of trees, and they are currently without power, which may not be restored for another two weeks. In addition, the summer camp lake dam has had a mudslide, and engineers are currently inspecting it.

The Board Of World Mission is partnering with our friends at Laurel Ridge to help with cleanup, as well as to assist them as they reach out to their neighbors in need. In the short term, the camp will be seeking to distribute food and supplies to their neighbors as well as cleaning up the camp grounds, and repairing their buildings. Then, in the longer term they will look to host mission teams to help with projects on the camp, but also in the homes of those who live around the camp. # Northern Province Endorses Christians Against Christian Nationalism

The Provincial Elders' Conference of the Moravian Church Northern Province recently endorsed Christians Against Christian Nationalism. Scan the QR code to see the endorsement. The PEC also prepared the longer endorsement and commendation below.



The Moravian Church Northern Province (MCNP) rejects Christian nationalism as a distortion of the gospel of Jesus Christ; as supporting the sins and systems of racism and white supremacy; and as a threat to democracy.

Further, Christian nationalism is inconsistent with The Moravian Covenant for Christian Living (MCCL) which calls us to show love towards all people in our witness to the world:

#### Northern Province Endorses Christians Against Christian Nationalism (continued)

We will not hate, despise, slander, or otherwise injure anyone. We will ever strive to manifest love towards all people, to treat them in a kind and friendly manner, and in our dealings with them to approve ourselves upright, honest, and conscientious, as becomes children of God. Together with the universal Christian Church, we have a concern for this world, opening our heart and hand to our neighbors with the message of the love of God, and being ever ready to minister of our substance to their necessities (Matthew 25:40) MCCL: 5:29

Regarding civic life, the Covenant states: Considering it a special privilege to live in a democratic society, we will faithfully fulfill the responsibilities of our citizenship, among which are intelligent and well-informed voting, a willingness to assume public office, guiding the decisions of government by the expression of our opinions, and supporting good government by our personal efforts. MCCL: 4:26

We, the Provincial Elders Conference of the Moravian Church Northern Province endorsed the Christians Against Christian Nationalism Statement and we commend them for their work in opposing Christian nationalism and for their contributions of educational, advocacy, and organizing resources to these efforts.








# Crossroads Lay Leadership Program: Compass with Jeremy Lau begins Oct. 17th

Our introductory course, Compass, takes participants through two different paths. First, it is a discernment process to help the participant identify their gifts, passion, and style. Through reading, journaling, and a valuable small group process, participants are encouraged to explore, articulate, and hone their personal sense of call as a lay person in the church and in the community.

Second, Compass is the place to polish up writing, research, and presentation skills. If you haven't been in a classroom in a very long time, this course will help you get back into the disciplines of learning. If at all possible, take this course early in your Crossroads experience.







# Being A Christian Citizen: A Bible Study For Our Time About the Study:

This Bible Study uses the Moravian Covenant for Christian Living (MMCL), Chapter 4, "The Witness of the Christian Citizen," and related scriptures as an outline for the five one-hour sessions.

Use of <u>Being a Christian Citizen</u> has been encouraged by the Provincial Elders' Conference and the bishops, who write: "We, the bishops of the Northern and Southern Provinces have reviewed this Bible Study produced by the NP Racial Justice Team and together we recommend the use of this study be considered in the congregations of the Northern and Southern Provinces."

#### World Communion Sunday: Sunday, October 6th

On the first Sunday in October, Christian communions around the globe celebrate World Communion Sunday, a day when we give thanks for the unity in Christ that binds us together in faith and witness. The Moravian Church observes this special day, with many congregations celebrating Holy Communion. We encourage pastors and congregations to pray for the faithful witness of our full communion partners and name them within the context of worship: the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, The Episcopal Church, the United Methodist Church, the Anglican Church of Canada, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, and our Covenant Relationship with the Presbyterian Church (USA). In addition, we invite pastors to pray for the congregations in their neighborhoods and with whom they cooperate throughout the year.



# Pastoral Letter Concerning Christian Community from Bishops of the Northern and Southern Provinces

As bishops of the Moravian Unity in the Northern and Southern Provinces, we greet you in the name of Jesus Christ, our Chief Elder. We had the blessing of spending August 19-23, 2024, in community at Laurel Ridge, the Moravian Conference Center in North Carolina. This has allowed us time to share fellowship and worship, discuss matters of importance, and pray for our Moravian Church.

In the Upper Room with his disciples, Jesus prayed: "I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one." (John 17:20) We believe this is Jesus' prayer for us today.

What does it mean for us to be "one" when we live in a world of competing interests, values, and political points of view? How does this guide our civic discourse in these divided times? This divisiveness is nowhere more apparent than in our current political environment, where candidates' language and behavior directly conflict with our Lord's teachings.

As bishops, we acknowledge the diversity of thought that exists among ourselves. Still, we come together in love and mutual respect for one another because we find common ground in our commitment to Jesus Christ and our love and commitment to the Moravian Church. We challenge the Moravian Church to model a way of being together that does not yield to the pressures of polarization and fragmentation so evident in our society.

Rather than creating division, we affirm The Ground of the Unity, which states: We confess our share in the guilt which is manifest in the severed and divided state of Christendom. By means of such divisions we ourselves hinder the message and power of the Gospel. We recognize the danger of self-righteousness and judging others without love. Since we together with all Christendom are pilgrims on the way to meet our coming Lord, we welcome every step that brings us nearer the goal of unity in Him. He Himself invites us to communion in His supper. Through it He leads the Church toward that union which He has promised. (Unitas Fratrum as a Unity)

We are called to live in Christian community and see each other as children of God; this does not require us to agree on all issues. We are in relationship because God has called us together to be faithful to Christ as our Chief Elder by serving a world in need of grace.

Jesus prayed that we may all be one – as Bishops, we echo this prayer for our Church today.

Brother John D. Hoenig passed away peacefully into the nearer presence of our Chief Elder, Jesus Christ on Tuesday, September 10, 2024, at the Veterans Home in Vineland, NJ.

Brother Hoenig was born on July 9, 1943, in Brooklyn, NY. He was the son of the late Adolph and Adeline (Brick) Hoenig. Brother Hoenig graduated from Moravian College in 1978 with a B.A. and from Moravian Theological Seminary in 1980 with an M. Div. He was ordained on January 6, 1980, and consecrated a Presbyter on June 10, 1984. He was united in marriage to Barbara Jayne Price on March 23, 1968, at the Vanderbilt Moravian Church, Staten Island, NY. He was a loving father to his daughter, Holly (Chris) Gallo and to his son the late David Hoenig. He was the cherished grandfather of Lauren and Vincent Gallo. He was the brother of Elsie Carrick and Uncle to Pete (Tana) Cali, Louise (Robert) Sims and Anthony (Terri) Cali.

Brother Hoenig served the Palmyra Moravian Church, Cinnaminson, NJ, served in specialized ministry as Director of Christian Ministry with Church Stewardship Administration Counselors and served Philadelphia Third Moravian Church in Philadelphia, PA. John proudly served his country in the US Marines. He served two tours in Vietnam and was a purple heart recipient. ## Van Es Camp & Conference Centre


Planning has already begun for the 2025 camp season, which we will expand to 3 weeklong camps.


