

In Essentials, Unity In Nonessentials, Liberty In All Things, Love Congregational Watchword for 2024 God called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. 1 Peter 2:9c

Dear Friends in Christ.

Nearly a year ago, we choose our congregation's watchword text, 1 Peter 2:9c: "God called you out of darkness into God's marvelous light." Throughout Advent, we wait for the coming of The Light of the World, even Jesus Christ, Yet, the darkness is often where growth and transformation occurs before new life begins.

On the first Sunday in Advent, children and youth in our Sunday School program will hear from "Growing in God's Love," the story of God's miraculous gift of a son to aging parents, Elizabeth and Zechariah. In the darkness of their long wait, and in the silence of pessimism, God renews their hope, releases them to sing a new song, and brings them both the child they longed for, and new life for themselves. Zechariah will name the child John, and will proclaim God's purpose for John's life:

> ⁷⁶ And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High.

for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,

to give his people knowledge of salvation

by the forgiveness of their sins.

⁷⁸ Because of the tender mercy of our God.


the dawn from on high will break ¹ upon¹ us,

⁷⁹ to shine upon those who sit in

darkness and in the shadow of death.

to guide our feet into the way of peace." (Luke 1:76-79)

While we wait for the Dayspring from on high, and for the light to break upon us, we open ourselves to miraculous possibilities for transformation and renewal of hope as we prepare the way for the Lord's coming. The ways of our preparations are to confess our sins and receive God's mercy, forgiveness, and saving grace; with the refining fire of God's prophetic word, to be freed from impurities that dull our compassion and empathy, and our experience of God's covenantal love; and awaken to the peace that surpasses all understanding. This is God's way of peace, a peace that endures as we follow the Prince of Peace, take off our shoes and travel the mountainous barriers of life to bring good news and proclaim peace, to say, "God's reigns." (Isaiah 52:7) May the Light of the World bring you renewed hope and peace this Advent. Pr. Sue 2



FIRST MORAVIAN UNIFIED BOARD

Members of the Unified Board met on November 24 at 12:30 pm. Pastor Sue opened the meeting with prayer. The agenda, October 20, 2024 meeting minutes and Pastor's October report were approved with one clarify-



ing correction. Highlights from the November meeting include:

- Output of the set o
- Approval of the date of January 19, 2025 for our annual Church Council meeting, with January 26 as a back-up date if needed.
- Frank Chisesi advised the Board of our current financial status: to date, we have a deficit of \$9,783, and a cash balance of \$11,626 with approximately \$3,000 of those funds restricted; medical and LTD payments for remaining months in the amount of \$1,950 will be paid before year-end. With receipt of notification of changes to our insurance policy, we will explore options for a lower deductible and rate.
- Frank reported that the application he submitted to the Larger Life Foundation for \$10,000 for church painting was approved! The estimate for the remaining painting is \$19,000. With the grant funds, and about \$2,000 in the Paint and Building Funds, and the generous offer of Frank Chisesi and Carl Lerch to paint the lower portions of the church, we will be able to complete the project next year. The Board expressed appreciation to Frank for all his hard work on behalf of First Moravian.
- ♦ The Board supported planning the Bell Dedication in the spring.
- ♦ A year-end congregational letter was approved.
- Responses from the Town Hall meeting on November 10 were reviewed and discussed with appreciation to those who provided feedback. The expressed hopes, concerns, and suggestions offered by the congregation will assist the Board's planning for 2025; initial plans for reaching out to past members were made.
- ♦ The Bazaar was a great success, raising \$2,005! We will increase the 2025 income budget for fundraisers to \$10,000.
- We reviewed the Advent and Christmas worship and event plans and are excited to have 30 people registered thus far for the *Miracle of Christmas* on December 7.
- ♦ The meeting concluded with The Lord's Prayer.

The next Unified Board meeting will be December 15 at 12:30 pm.
