

Dear Friends in Christ,

Early Christians celebrated Sundays as "The Eighth Day," the day of Christ's resurrection and the beginning of God's new creation. The first known written mention of the language of "The Eighth Day" was in the epistle of Barnabas from about 100 CE. The Eighth Day symbolized baptism and baptismal fonts were often in the shape of an octagon. In the sixth century, the eighth day of Christmas began to be recognized as "The Circumcision and Name of Jesus. Jewish boys were circumcised and formally named on the eighth day of their lives; circumcision was a sign of God's covenant. Later, the "octave" of Christmas, January 1, was called, "Name of Jesus." It is in the name of Jesus, and into his death, that we are baptized and raised to new life.

Jesus is known by many names. He is the Alpha and Omega, the Lamb of God, the Son of God, the Good Shepherd, the Redeemer. the Bread of Life, the Resurrection and the Life. In the Christmas season especially, he is named Immanuel, Savior, The Word, The Light of the World, and Wonderful Counselor, Almighty God. Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6).

Isaiah's prophecy is heard through the centuries by people who sit in darkness. On them, a great light is shining. Jesus fulfills God's promise of One who will order all things new, who will bring the kingdom of heaven to earth where there will be "peace and prosperity marked by justice and righteousness. Jesus announces his mission in the words of Isaiah in Luke 4:18-19:

> "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed. to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

We have been baptized in the name of Christ, the Prince of Peace. May we who bear his name be bearers of light, committed to peace. justice and righteousness in the name of Jesus. Amen. Pr. Sue

FIRST MORAVIAN UNIFIED BOARD

Members of the Unified Board met on December 15 at 12:30 pm. Pastor Sue opened the meeting with prayer. The agenda, November 24, 2024 meeting minutes and Pastor's November report were approved by those present, motion by Sue Ficzko, second by Gwen Triolo. Highlights from the December meeting include:

- Pastor Sue noted that the FSA and Record of Action Forms related to payroll for the new year were available for signature.
- We received with joy the news of the birth of Melanie Mae Boyd to parents Jada Bullock and Roger Boyd. Janet Balogun called with Christmas greetings and blessings for the congregation.
- Frank reported our investment account with MMFA has now recovered to our initial investment with slight earnings of \$211.
- ♦ The formation of the Nominating Committee was discussed. Sue Ficzko and Susanne Kessler (as needed and available) will be the Board members for the Committee; an at-large member from the congregation will be invited to serve on the Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee will be extending invitations to members to serve on the Unified Board.
- Fundraising possibilities were discussed. A "Pound Auction" will be added to next year's calendar. Other suggestions included pizza kit sales, restaurant fundraisers, and soup and hoagie sales. Some helpful feedback and suggestions were offered to increase the gift card sales.
- ♦ The Miracle of Christmas event and Children's Christmas Shop were reviewed; Church Council date of January 19, 2025 was confirmed; and upcoming services were highlighted (Blue Christmas, Carols & Lullabies, and Christmas Eve.)
- ♦ The renewal date for the rental agreement with Oasis is January 31; Frank has arranged for snow removal as needed.
- ♦ The meeting concluded with prayer.

WORSHIP IN JANUARY 10:45 am

The Epiphany of the Lord is January 6 and the season after Epiphany begins in worship services on Sunday, January 12. This season of the revealing of Jesus as the Christ will continue through March 2 this year. Ash Wednesday will be March 5 and the First Sunday in Lent is March 9.

Jan. 5, Second Sun. of Christmas/Sunday School (Robotics, Unified Board)

We will continue our celebration of the birth of Jesus with the Christmas liturgy and carols. The gospel text is John 1:(1-9), 10-18: "The Word became flesh and brought grace and truth into the world." Sunday School for children will meet during worship following the Children's Message.



Jan. 12, First Sun. after the Epiphany/Holy Communion (Parsonage Open House)

On this day we will read of the Baptism of Our Lord, in Luke 3:15-17, 21-22, and celebrate a service of Holy Communion for Epiphany. We rejoice in God's gift of the holy sacraments.

Jesus reveals his glory at a wedding in Cana, showing by turning water into wine that God's creative power and joy are manifest in the world in him. In Christ, there is always an invitation to come to the wedding banquet! We will recognize Martin Luther King, Jr. Day with a special liturgy.

Jan. 26, Third Sun. after the Epiphany/Ecumenical Sunday (inclement weather date for Church Council)

In the reading from Luke 4:14-21, Jesus claims his identity, purpose, and mission, from which the followers of Jesus take their own purpose and mission.


CELEBRATIONS OF NEW LIFE

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

January 18-25, 2025

Do you believe? (Jn. 11:26)

The prayers, reflections and theme for the 2025 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity were developed by the ecumenical monastic community of Bose in northern Italy. This community of predominately lay women and lay men has several monasteries in Italy by approval of the Catholic Bishops Conference of Italy and invites all Christians to retreats and participation in the Benedictine tradition of prayer and work. The theme and texts were the result of meetings at Bose with representatives of the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches and the Holy See's Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity in the autumn of 2023.

In 2025, the whole Church commemorates the 1,700th anniversary of the first Ecumenical Council of the entire church at that time, called by the Emperor Constantine at Nicaea (presently in the country of Turkey) in the early summer of 325. Aside from important disciplinary agreements, such as a common date for Easter, the Council discussed and debated orthodoxy of doctrine, especially about what Christians believe about the nature of God as Trinity and the two natures, human and divine, of Jesus Christ. The result was an agreed upon Creed, what we today call the Nicene Creed...It is only appropriate then, in remembering this event of common confession, that Christians today may celebrate that which unites them. Spiritual ecumenism, according to Vatican II, is the "soul" of the ecumenical movement. It is our common faith in the Risen Christ that brings us together for prayer. In turn, the prayer itself is effective in nourishing and confirming our unity. In the year of 2025, all Christians East and West will have a common date for Easter, something Nicaea tried most seriously to settle...Easter will be celebrated on April 20.

ECUMENICAL SUNDAY, January 26, 2025

The Northern Province of the Moravian Church in America shares full communion relationships and ecumenical partnerships with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), the Episcopal Church, the United Methodist Church, the Presbyterian Church (USA), the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC), and the Anglican Church of Canada. Churches in full communion do not need to agree on every doctrinal point, but are understood to have enough in common to worship together. In practice, this means that members of both denominations can participate in the same sacraments, and clergy of one denomination can serve a congregation of the other denomination. (mcnp.org)
