

Dear Friends in Christ.

You may be familiar with the names **Katherine Goble Johnson**, **Dorothy Vaughnn**, and **Mary Jackson**, particularly if you have watched the 2016 film, *Hidden Figures*. If you are like me, you never heard their names or stories before the film was released. *Hidden Figures* tells the story of three female African-American mathematicians who worked at NASA during the Space Race, and it depicts some of the forms of discrimination faced by Black Americans in the US, and their brave persistence in overcoming the obstacles placed in their paths. Katherine Goble Johnson went on to calculate the trajectories for the Apollo 11 and Space Shuttle missions. She was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2015; and in 2016, NASA dedicated the Langley Research Center's Katherine Johnson Computational Building in her honor.

It was only last week, that I learned about the **Six Triple Eight** and **Major Charity Adams** from a movie released just last year. "The 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion...was an all-Black battalion of the US Women's Army Corps (WAC) that managed postal services. The 6888th had 855 women and was led by Major Charity Adams. It was the only predominantly Black US Women's Army Corps unit sent overseas during World War II. The group motto was "No mail, low morale". The battalion was organized into five companies: Headquarters, and Companies A, B, C, and D. Most of the 6888th worked as postal clerks, but others were cooks, mechanics and held other support positions, so that the 6888th was a self-sufficient unit. The 688th were repeatedly set up to fail in their mission. But they exceeded all expectations. (The film is on Netflix.)

Just as most life-long Moravians never heard of The Rev. Dr. Charles Martin and The 1917 Silent Protest Parade until the MCNP Synod of 2023, there is much to learn in every month of the year about Black History. The 2025 Calendar from the Equal Justice Initiative is an invaluable tool for daily learning. I have participated in three series of Sacred Ground, "a film and readings-based dialogue series focused on race and grounded in faith, designed to facilitate open and respectful conversations about America's history of racism by examining personal experiences within the context of broader societal issues." In every Sacred Ground group, the phrase heard most often is, "No one ever taught me that." Sacred Ground will be offered again starting in August. I hope you will join us. Black **History Month** is one opportunity for intentionally learning some of what we have not been taught. Pr. Sue 2

FIRST MORAVIAN UNIFIED BOARD

Members of the Unified Board met on January 5 at 12:15 pm. Pastor Sue opened the meeting with prayer. The agenda, December 15, 2024 meeting minutes and Pastor's December 2024 report were approved by those present. Highlights from the December meeting include:



- Frank provided a brief financial status report and advised of a notice we received of a change in our insurance broker. Earlier we learned that our deductible would be increasing from one to five thousand dollars (an industry change) and our premium would be increasing.
- Frank reviewed the 2025 budget that is the same as 2024 at \$130,000. Board members approved the proposed budget for submission to Church Council for consideration. Frank also advised that he will be completing paperwork to renew our PA tax exemption status as required every five years. The Unified Board expressed its gratitude to Frank for serving as our Treasurer and Financial Secretary.
- The Nominating Committee updated the Board on its progress. Mike LoQuasto, Sr. will assist as a member of this year's Nominating Committee. Wendy Mamana is serving as the at-large congregational member.
- Pastor Sue reported briefly on the worship, music, spiritual formation and other ministries of the church. Advent and Christmas services all went well, with the Longest Night/Blue Christmas service increasing in attendance this year over last. Sunday School on February 2 will conclude the module on the Birth of Jesus, and we will need to purchase new curriculum for March. The next service of Holy Communion will be for Epiphany on January 12. The Open House at the parsonage will also be on January 12.
- ♦ The Board reviewed and approved the draft 2025 Calendar.
- The lease with Oasis concludes January 31, 2025; we have confirmed with Oasis that they would like to renew the lease for 2025. Snow removal arrangements have been made.

The next Unified Board meeting will be February 2, 2025 at 12:15 pm. Installation of church leaders will be held that day in worship.

CHURCH PAINTING

First Moravian is blessed to have been awarded a \$10,000 grant from the Moravian Larger Life Foundation to assist with the remaining church painting. **Three things are needed**: ongoing donations to the Paint Fund, help with painting the lower portions of the church, and recommendations for a painter to paint the higher portions of the church. Thank you for your gifts of all kinds!

WORSHIP IN FEBRUARY 10:45 am

The season of the revealing of Jesus as the Christ will continue through March 2 this year, and God's glory will be revealed in unexpected times and places. Ash Wednesday is March 5; First Sunday in Lent is March 9.

<u>Feb. 2, 4th Sun. after Epiphany, Sunday School (Robotics, Unified Board)</u>

Jesus, teaching back in his hometown of Nazareth, is first received with delight and amazement by his community. This changes quickly and turns deadly, as Jesus invites them to consider that God has welcomed outsiders and treated them with kindness. (Luke 4:21-30) Sunday School for children will meet during worship following the Children's Message. To prepare, read the Epistle text, 1 Corinthians 13:1-13.

Feb. 9, 5th Sun. after Epiphany/Prayer & Anointing for Healing

The first disciples hear and respond to the call of Jesus to follow him, leaving all things behind. Three fisherman become apostles of the Lord after the creative powers of Jesus are revealed. Slowly they come to understand the risk and sacrifice involved in following Jesus. (Luke 5:1-11)

Feb. 16, 6th Sun. after Epiphany

The Sermon on the Plain is the gospel text from Luke 6:17-26. As Jesus teaches among the people, he is touchable, near to those who gather to listen to his words and to be touched and healed. Blessings and woes describe the "great reversal" of God. We will welcome Pastor Pat Honszer as our guest preacher this Sunday.

Feb. 23, 7th Sun. after Epiphany

Radical love for all is Jesus's message today: Luke 6:27-38.

Unity Prayer Day Offering 2025—Sunday, March 2, 2025 Common Moravian Theological Curriculum in Spanish

Since our earliest days, the Unitas Fratrum has placed an emphasis on education, both vocational and theological. Today, there are Moravian seminaries and theological training centers across the world. These institutions are central to our ministry as a Church because they train the leaders of our Unity and give them the knowledge needed to serve our Chief Elder in their respective cultural and political contexts.

Through this Unity Prayer Day Offering, the American Board of World Mission (ABWM) will work with the Unity Committee on Theology (UCOT) and Moravian leaders and educators worldwide to produce a common theological training curriculum that can be adapted and used throughout the Unity and starting specifically with our Spanish speaking partners. This curriculum will include training in the Bible and Biblical Languages, Theology and Church History, and Pastoral Theology. The special offering for the Unity Prayer Day will be received on March 2, 2025.

CHURCH COUNCIL 2025

Our annual Church Council meeting was held on Sunday, January 26, 2025, after snowy weather caused us to change the date from January 19, 2025. We enjoyed a marvelous and plentiful covered dish lunch, and then convene as Church Council at shortly after 1 pm. We extend out gratitude to everyone who participated in the very informative meeting, with insightful questions and conversation that will continue and which has generated new ideas.

We remembered those dear members of the congregation who had entered the more immediate presence of the Savior in the preceding year: Mina Cigus, Ruth Erb, Evelyn Gulick, and Paul Peifer; and gave thanks for our 11 new members: Brian, Samantha, Nico and Rosie Smith, Chad Hendershot, Carl Lerch, Dale and Pat Johnson, David and Sandra Morrisette, and Luke Michael Davis. We were honored to take part in the marriage celebration of the Seth and Destiny Conard, and the birth of Melanie Boyd. From the reports, the highlights included appreciation to the Church & Society Committee for the return of Blanket Sunday, and to Laurie Toyberg for excellent work and support of the congregation.

We expressed our appreciation for those who have served on the Unified Board this past year, and especially to Talia Austin and Deb LoQuasto whose two— and three-year terms were expiring. We are grateful for their service. We also thanked those whose terms are continuing for their service: Zakk Davis, Sue Ficzko, Susanne Kessler, and Gwen Triolo. We are delighted that Mike LoQuasto, Sr. will serve a second three-year term. We will welcome to the Unified Board four new members for a first three-year term. Elected with gratitude for their willingness to serve were Carrie Cigus, Esther Cigus, Walt Cigus, and Destiny Conard.

Pastor Sue shared that the MCNP requires pastors to retire at 70. However, pastors may continue in their positions contractually in one-year increments. It is planned that Pastor Sue will continue to serve as pastor of First Moravian under contract beginning in July.

Frank presented the 2025 budget of \$130,000 which was approved. Frank also gave a report on the "Moravian Money" gift cards and encouraged the congregation to purchase gift cards as a way to easily raise funds for the church's ministries. Frank also asked that anyone who is traveling where there is a Ruby Tuesdays to please buy a gift card. All their sites in our area have closed. The meeting ended at 2:10 pm (in time to watch the Eagles!
