

Dear Friends in Christ,

I was recently sharing my sense of the urgent and critical nature of these days, and feeling increasingly drawn to quiet times of prayer, reflection, and stillness with a group of spiritual companions. In sharing these thoughts, another member of the group



introduced me to Bayo Akomolafe, a philosopher, author, activist, and international speaker who has won awards for his unconventional ideas. He may be best known for his essay, "A Slower Urgency," and the African saying that is the title of his most recent book, "The times are urgent, let us slow down."

In his essay, Akomolafe writes, "...the call to slow down works to bring us face to face with the invisible, the hidden, the unremarked, the yet-to-be-resolved. Sometimes, what is the appropriate thing to do is not the effective thing to do. Slowing down is thus about lingering in the places we are not used to. Seeking out new questions. Becoming accountable to more than what rests on the surface. Seeking roots..."

In the coming season of Lent, let us slow down, contemplate our faith and relationship with God, listen to Jesus, and discern faithful responses to the urgencies of now. Let us seek new questions and the deep roots of patience, forgiveness, and grace that sustains us. Have a holy and blessed Lent. *Pr. Sue*

FIRST MORAVIAN UNIFIED BOARD

Members of the Unified Board met on February 2 at 12:15 pm. Pastor Sue opened the meeting with prayer, and we welcomed our new Board members, Walt, Carrie, and Es-



ther Cigus, and Destiny Conard. Board orientation materials and communications were reviewed. Pastor Sue asked the Board to consider participating in serving Holy Communion for a future discussion. We affirmed the ongoing participation in Holy Communion by those joining our services on Zoom. The agenda for the meeting, the minutes of January 5, and the January Pastor's Report were reviewed and approved.

A significant portion of the meeting was spent discussing questions for our annual report for the Province and District. These included concerns and what would be helpful to address them, ministries that are bringing us hope, and plans for the new year. The Board planned a "March Moravian Money Gift Card Challenge," setting a goal to sell \$5,500 in gift cards during March. Pastor Sue reviewed a letter from the MCNP Racial Justice Team regarding, "Caring for Immigrant and Refugee Neighbors." Upcoming services and events were reviewed. The letter to renew the Oasis lease has been sent for signature. The next meeting date will be confirmed via email.

MARCH "MORAVIAN MONEY" FUNDRAISER CHALLENGE

WHAT: The First Moravian Church of Easton's newly installed Unified Board voted to hold a March Fundraiser Challenge – with the goal of selling \$5,500 Moravian Money gift cards or more. We would receive between 5-13% (\$275-\$715) from the gift card companies.

WORSHIP IN MARCH 10:45 am March 2, Last Sunday after Epiphany & Transfiguration Sunday/Sunday School (Robotics)

The season after Christ's Epiphany draws to a close on Transfiguration Sunday. Today we will remember Jesus on the mountaintop and the voice of God coming through the cloud to proclaim the beloved Son and command us to listen to him. This is the Prayer Day for the work of our worldwide Moravian Unity, and we will receive the annual Unity Offering during our service. Sunday School will be held after a brief children's message.

March 5, Ash Wednesday, 7 pm

The season of Lent begins today, and will stretch over the next 40 days, excluding Sundays. Our Ash Wednesday service will be held at 7 pm, and include an opportunity for the imposition of ashes.





March 9, First Sunday in Lent

This Sunday's gospel text is Luke's story of Jesus' temptation (Luke 4:1-13) before he calls his disciples and begins his ministry. The service will include the Lent 1 Liturgy, the message will be "A Litany of Resistance," and we will celebrate Holy Communion. We

are called to repentance, to turning back to God, and to resisting temptation and sin. (Daylight Savings Time begins today.)

March 16, Second Sunday in Lent

Jesus weeps over the city of Jerusalem, and laments the disobedience of the people. In mothering language, he expresses his longing to protect them and keep them from harm, but they were not willing. A Litany of Protection will frame our reflection on the gospel text, Luke 13:31-35.

March 23, Third Sunday in Lent

Luke 13:1-9 recounts Jesus' response to a question about suffering and tragedies that opens a space for him to talk about God's patience and grace. The day's message will be "A Litany of Patience," and a reflection on the "slow work of God."

March 30, Fourth Sunday in Lent

The story of the "Forgiving Father" (also called the "Prodigal Son") is the gospel reading for this Sunday late in Lent. "A Litany of Forgiveness," will remind us of God's amazing grace.

CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL

First Sunday Sunday School will meet on Sunday, March 2 at



10:45 am. With so many events in the life of Jesus to teach in the two first Sundays of March and April, this month the lessons will focus on Jesus' temptation in the wilderness and Palm Sunday. In April, the lessons will draw from the events of Holy Week and Easter. Children will spend a brief time with their families and the congregation at the start of the service, and then go to the Fellowship Hall for Sunday School. Registration forms and

Unity Prayer Day Offering 2025—Sunday, March 2, 2025

Common Moravian Theological Curriculum in Spanish Since our earliest days, the Unitas Fratrum has placed an emphasis on education, both vocational and theological. Today, there are Moravian seminaries and theological training centers across the world. These institutions are central to our ministry as a Church because they train the leaders of our Unity and give them the knowledge needed to serve our Chief Elder in their respective cultural and political contexts.

Through this Unity Prayer Day Offering, the American Board of World Mission (ABWM) will work with the Unity Committee on Theology (UCOT) and Moravian leaders and educators worldwide to produce a common theological training curriculum that can be adapted and used throughout the Unity and starting specifically with our Spanish speaking partners. This curriculum will include training in the Bible and Biblical Languages, Theology and Church History, and Pastoral Theology. <u>The special offering for the Unity Prayer</u> <u>Day will be received on March 2, 2025.</u>

Eastern District Hiring Area Directors of Faith Formation

The Eastern District is embarking on a new venture to provide leadership and support for congregational faith formation. Believing that education and formation are at the heart of our mission, the Eastern District Executive Board recently approved a proposal from our current Director of Christian Education, Marie Couts, outlining a program where the District will be divided into four areas and each area will be served by a Director of Faith Formation.
