



Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places.

John 14:1-2

Dear Beloved Friends in Christ,

During the season of Lent, we have been reflecting on five experiences of God's grace in our lives through a series of Litanies of Faith on resistance, protection, patience, forgiveness, and finally, and greatness, love, which will be our theme on the first Sunday of April.

We prayed for God to *remove from us a spirit of resistance* to God's call for us to change, to new opportunities for spiritual growth and prayer, for taking on untried ways of serving in Jesus' name that we might, through the power of the Holy Spirit, accept God's invitations with trust and confidence. We then prayed for God to *give us spirit of resistance*: to resist all that would prevent us from seeing God's promised future; for courage and strength to overcome fear that often leads to the temporary triumph of evil; to open our eyes to the sin within us, so that we may repent and be forgiven. We prayed that we would be embolden by the Holy Spirit to resist hate and violence, falsehoods, and oppressive powers and principalities that cause harm to God's creation including those created in God's image, and especially those most vulnerable; and to live with genuine love and kindness for all people, walking in God's ways of peace and righteousness. May it be so.

We recalled how Jesus wept over the city of Jerusalem, lamenting and longing to gather and protect its inhabitants, like a mother hen protects her chicks under her wings, even laying down her life to defend them. Yet, they resisted; they were not willing to return to God. Mothering Christ, we prayed, you are our dwelling place. Under the shadow of your wings, we rest secure. When the outcomes we long for in this life do not come, we trust in your unending love and mercies. You preserve our lives. Under the shadow of your cross and in the light of your resurrection that breaks through the darkness of the empty tomb, you are our light and salvation. Christ our Protector, you are the resurrection and the life.

As we enter Holy Week, let us "trust in the slow work of God," who, like a patient gardener, is working in the soil of our hearts this Lenten season to prepare us to yield to God, to resist evil, to protect the vulnerable, to repent and be forgiven, to forgive, to love, and to bear good fruit for nourishing and healing the world. Let us give our hearts over to God and "clothe ourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience "(Col. 3:12,13.) Let us love, and may the light of Christ's resurrection break upon us, our hearts broken opened for the love of the world. *Pastor Sue* 2

<u>COMMUNITY NEWS</u> Easton Children's Home Celebrating 140 Years

The Easton Children's Home was organized in 1885 to provide care to children in the community. They are celebrating their 140th anniversary this year. At their meeting on March 16, the Unified Board decided to acknowledge this milestone and the Children's Home's contributions to the well being of children with a contribution of \$140. (For the past several years, we have included \$250 in our budget for local and Moravian causes.)

The Easton Children's Home is three years older that First Moravian! We will mark our 137th anniversary on April 1, 2025. The church was organized on Easter Sunday, April 1, 1888.

FIRST MORAVIAN UNIFIED BOARD

Members of the Unified Board met on March 16 at 12:15 pm. Pastor Sue opened the meeting with prayer. The agenda for the meeting, the minutes of February 2, and the February Pastor's Report were reviewed and approved. The matters discussed included the following:

- Correspondence from the Province regarding the 2026 Provincial \Diamond Synod and the need for a Special Church Council to elect a delegate and alternate before October 2025. The Board set the date of September 21 for the Special Church Council.
- Plans for an annual stewardship emphasis in the fall using a re- \Diamond source entitled, "Found Faithful" from the Ecumenical Stewardship Center; and for including stewardship education as part of our Sunday School program.
- The March Moravian Money Fundraiser Challenge is going very well with sales for the first three Sundays of March totaling \$4,070 towards our goal of \$5,500! Fourteen individuals or families participated, purchasing 73 gift cards. A goal of \$1,200 was set for the Yard Sale to be held on May 17; we will receive donations beginning April 21. Plans for a Spring "Oldies" Dance fundraiser are pending.
- Review of our current Child Protection Policy; no changes were \Diamond recommended. Plans were established for tracking status and renewal dates for background checks.
- Treasurer Frank Chisesi provided a summary of the results of the \Diamond Moravian Day of Giving (MDG); and our current financial status. Thirty-four people donated on the MDG for a total of \$2,915. As of the end of March, we have a net loss of \$996; recent donations via the MMFA portal totaling \$3,715 (including MDG funds) will assist with paying upcoming expenses, including insurance and payroll.
- Children's Bible Presentation will be scheduled next year for \Diamond younger children; the current Sunday School curriculum, Growing in God's Love is working well so there will be no change.
- Arndt's Lutheran Church has invited us to consider sharing in a \Diamond food ministry for the community. We are interested in this opportunity and will request more information.
- The Bell Dedication will be part of our Anniversary Sunday celebration on April 27.
- Frank is arranging for the stabilization of the railing leading to the \Diamond balconv.
- The Oasis congregation is now holding its Sunday services in the \Diamond sanctuary.

The next Unified Board meeting will be April 13, 2025.

The Church and Society Committee extends their gratitude to everyone who supported this year's "Blanket Sunday" for Church World Service held **Sunday, March 16**. Thank you for helping to "blanket the world with love" by supporting this essential ministry that serves so many people in great need. Through your generous hearts and gifts, we received donations of \$293 through March 23. We will conclude the project on March 30. Church World Service (CWS) is a non-profit organization that works to end hunger and poverty, and promote peace and justice. They are also one of the largest providers of refugee resettlement services. CWS was founded in 1946 after World War II. The Moravian Church in North America is a Covenant Member of Church World Service.

The Unified Board presented the congregation with a challenge in the month of March. It was called the **March Moravian Money Challenge!** The challenge was to sell \$5,500 in gift cards during the

This is cause for celebration! Congratulations for an amazing response to the challenge! A robust "thank you" to everyone who purchased gift cards during the month. We will announce the final total in sales for March, and the winner of the cake, on Sunday, April 6 during the worship service. We hope you will continue to purchase gift cards during the remaining months of the year for all the purchases for which gift cards are available. Please place your orders with Frank Chisesi or see Frank on Sundays following worship. Our annual goal is \$50,000 in card sales, an average of \$4,400 per month for the remainder of the year. This will provide an anticipated return of \$3,000. This truly is "a piece of cake" fundraiser requiring very little effort—with the exception of Frank's work to manage the program, and to whom we extend our gratitude and appreciation.

A REMINDER FOR HOLY WEEK

In June 2023, the Synod of the MCNP passed legislation entitled, "Antisemitism and Jewish-Christian Relations." The legislation, the *Fifth Partial Report of the Church and Society Committee*, noted that "...antisemitic incidents in the United States and Canada reached all-time highs in 2022 and 2021, respectively"; and that "there is a history of antisemitism in Christianity beginning about 150 CE with interpretations of the Gospel of John...and continuing through the centuries to the teaching and preaching of Protestant reformers that was later used to support the killing of millions of people during the Holocaust, and which persists today..."

The Synod recognized that, "Christian churches, including the Moravian Church Northern Province, may be inadvertently perpetuating antisemitism and contributing to its rise through our liturgies, hymns..., and worship resources, including scriptural references and other texts read without explanation of their context; the Moravian Book of Worship; "Readings for Holy Week;" and preaching and teaching in congregations..."

In light of this, two of the resolutions in the Synod Report encourage preachers, teachers, and other worship leaders to develop practices in the reading and interpretation of scripture that are less likely to lead to antisemitic interpretations and contribute to "dismantling antisemitism and anti-Jewish theology." These two resolutions include some suggested practices and are copied below. Our worship services during Holy Week will include materials to address these concerns.

RESOLVED: (21) The 2023 Synod of the Moravian Church Northern Province encourages preachers, teachers, and other worship leaders of the Moravian Church Northern Province, when reading scripture in public which uses the word "Jews," to provide notes expressing how the text "had been and continues to be, used to malign Jews," and accompanying related prayers of repentance [FN7]; and/or use language that is less likely to lead to antisemitic interpretations; and be it further

RESOLVED: (22) The 2023 Synod of the Moravian Church Northern Province encourages preachers, teachers, and other worship leaders of the Moravian Church Northern Province to consider in interpretations of scripture what is written in the texts, what the texts meant when they were written, and what they have come to mean in relationship to antisemitism and anti-Jewish theology, and how they might be understood in ways that contribute to dismantling antisemitism and anti-Jewish theology in proclamation and teaching "[FN 8]; ...
